U-turn on funding cuts

THE Federal
Government has
backflipped on
planned funding cuts
to community legal
centres following an
outcry from service
providers, including
those in Cairns.

Last month, the Cairns
Post reported the city's
community legal centre would be
forced to cut vital services to
people struggling with debt,
family violence and employment
issues.

The Government had flagged it was preparing to cut \$35 million from the sector, which would



have amounted to about \$2 million less across Queensland.

But yesterday, Attorney-General George Brandis (left) said \$39 million of funding for

community legal centres and \$16.7 million for indigenous legal services over three years would be contained in next month's Budget.

Queensland Attorney-General Yvette D'Ath welcomed the move, but said the uncertainty had already harmed vulnerable people.
