UNDER Queensland Law, the term 'domestic violence' means behaviour by one person to another within an intimate personal, family or informal care relationship that is physical, sexual, emotional, psychological, financial, threatening, coercive or which in any other way controls that person and causes them to fear for the safety of themselves or others.

The law is broad because we, as a community, know that domestic violence occurs in all sorts of forms.

From ex-partners, to current partners, to children,

grandchildren and relatives, domestic violence has a rippling impact within our community and its consequences touch us all.


No one is exempt from domestic violence.
