

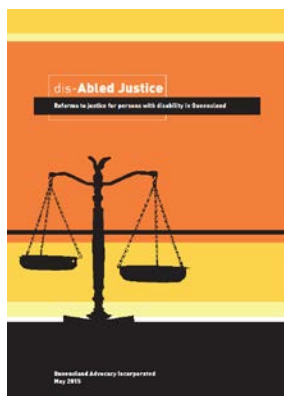

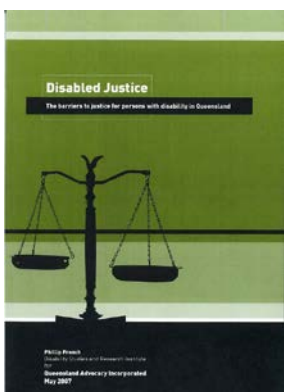
“dis-Abled Justice: Reforms to justice for persons with disability in Queensland.”
