WOMEN'S Legal Service Queensland (WLSQ) is preparing for lift-off in the lead up to their annual fundraising spectacular, Dancing CEOs.

City Hall will host 12 CEOs on May 18 — including Paddington's Katelyn Aslett — who have swapped their suits for sweats in a united effort to raise \$250,000 for women facing domestic violence abuse.
