# **Early Intervention**

#### **Triaging domestic violence matters**

- + Clients may need help with domestic and family violence matters though they are seeking help with a matter about other issues such as:
  - Tenancy matters (boarder disputes and homelessness)
  - Unfair dismissal and income support
  - Debts and related liabilities
  - Recovery of property and elder abuse cases
  - Discrete disputes about children's matters
  - Criminal law
  - Estate disputes
  - Complaints and
  - Court processes.
- + Know warning signs of at-risk clients.
- Consider intake procedures and interview protocols

## Top tips about social work responses

- + Always consider safety planning as a priority
- + Remain aware that your listening and observation skills are invaluable.
- Understand that a client experiencing stress and hardship will struggle to act on your advice
- + Build partnerships with your local community services and, if you do not have an in-house social worker, prioritise building links with your local services, including homelessness and housing services
- + Support your clients rather than dictate outcomes
- + Be sensitive to family dynamics.
- + Don't assume a dementia or mental health diagnosis means all capacity has been lost
- + Consider the best time and place for appointments
- + **Help** your clients with 'leg work' even if it is time intensive.
