Wunya is a Yuggera word that means welcome/greetings.

Wunya is the First Nations Employee Network event focusing on cultural self-care, connecting with communities across the state and yarning about experiences within the community legal sector.

When?

Wednesday 15 October from 9:00am to 4:00pm with optional social event from 4:00pm to 6:00pm

Thursday 16 October from 9:00am to 3:00pm.

Where?

Souths Leagues Club, 120 Jane Street West End

Who is this event for?

First Nations employees working in a Queensland community legal centre. It doesn't matter what your job title is, all Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander employees in a community legal centre in QLD are welcome.

How to get there

Public Transport – South Leagues Club is in West End. It is easily accessible by bus or a short walk from Brisbane CBD. Plan your journey on Translink. Bus stops nearby include routes 60, 199 and 192.

Parking – Free parking onsite.

Accommodation Options

There are lots of accommodation options in South Brisbane, South Bank and the Brisbane CBD!

Travel Subsidies

Thanks to project funding this year we are able to offer travel subsidies for those coming from outside the Greater Brisbane area.

Travel subsidies for this event are available for every eligible person, there is no cap per centre. Everyone who has to travel is eligible.

To be reimbursed for travel – you must follow the instructions on the Travel Subsidy Wunya 2025 – Info and Application form.

Option 1: Flights and Accommodation

Community Legal Centres Queensland will pay **up to \$750 per person** towards the costs of flights and accommodation.

Option 2: Driving and Accommodation

Community Legal Centres Queensland will pay **up to \$450 per person** towards the costs of accommodation, driving and parking.

FAQs about Travel Subsidies

What about meals or incidentals? The travel subsidy only covers travel and accommodation. Most centres have policies around travel allowances or per diem (daily) payments which can be used to cover meals and expense not covered by the Wunya Travel Subsidy. Talk to your manager or HR about this.

Morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea will be supplied each day as part of the event, along with food at the social event.

What if my travel costs more or less than the subsidy? You can only claim up to the travel allowances as listed above or the amount you have spent. For example, Under Option 1, if your expenses total \$1094, you can apply for \$750 but if your expenses total \$735, you can only apply for \$735.
